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Bringing the Ocean into the Classroom: *Ocean Adventures* Launches to Support Primary Teachers and Inspire Environmental Learning

London, UK — Science and environmental education consultant, and award-winning author, **Gloria Barnett** has launched **Ocean Adventures**, a complete **Year 1–6 curriculum-aligned programme** structured to help primary schools deliver meaningful ocean and environmental education across literacy, science, STEM and wider curriculum learning.

Created for children growing up in an uncertain world, *Ocean Adventures* helps schools explore vital themes about Planet Earth, including marine life, climate awareness, sustainability, conservation and environmental responsibility — while giving teachers ready-to-use materials that reduce planning time and support confident delivery in the classroom.

The programme goes beyond traditional classroom books by combining narrated adventure stories, original underwater video footage, structured literacy challenges and science-based activities. Drawing on Gloria's years of experience as a qualified scuba diver and underwater videographer, together with her role as a Science Education Consultant, these resources bring authentic ocean exploration directly into the primary classroom.

“Teachers are under enormous pressure, and they need high-quality resources that are both inspiring and practical,” says Gloria Barnett. “Children are naturally curious about the ocean, but they are also growing up with big questions about climate, nature and the future of the planet. *Ocean Adventures* helps teachers open those conversations through storytelling, science and real-world exploration — without adding to their workload.”

Designed for **Years 1–6**, the programme supports progression across the primary age range, enabling pupils to develop a deeper understanding of ocean ecosystems, environmental change and the part young people can play in protecting the natural world. It also supports literacy development, scientific enquiry, discussion, critical thinking and global citizenship.

Schools can use the materials for science lessons, literacy work, themed learning weeks, Eco-Schools projects, ocean topics, climate and sustainability work, or cross-curricular enrichment. Fiction and non-fiction books by Gloria Barnett are also available as companions to the programme, providing additional opportunities for class reading, independent reading, topic work and discussion.

A **FREE Guide to the *Ocean Adventures* Resources** is available to download from the website, giving teachers an overview of the programme and how the materials can be used to support curriculum-linked ocean and environmental learning. The guide also includes details of fiction and non-fiction companion books that can be used alongside the resources to enrich classroom learning, support reading for pleasure and deepen children's understanding of the ocean world.

Alongside the *Ocean Adventures* resources, Gloria Barnett's wider work includes school visits, science talks and workshops, ocean-themed fiction and non-fiction books for children, and educational consultancy supporting primary science and environmental learning.
